


Inquiry into Residential Care

Do You Have Views on Residential Care for Older People?

The National Assembly for Wales's Health and Social Care Committee has launched an inquiry into residential care for older people and is calling for evidence from interested individuals and organisations. The Committee's inquiry will examine the provision of residential care for older people in Wales and the way in which it can meet their current and future needs.

The aim of the Enquiry is to look at

- the process by which older people enter residential care
- the capacity for the care sector to meet the demand for services
- the quality of care and the experiences of carers and service users
- the effectiveness of regulation and inspection regimes
- new and emerging models of care provision

 the balance of public and independent sector provision

Please note that the Committee has agreed to focus the inquiry on residential care, although nursing care will inevitably be touched upon during discussions. The Committee has also decided to focus its attention on the provision of services for older people for the purpose of this inquiry.

A Vision for Barry Hospital

Barry Hospital will be the base for the newly developed Locality Health and Treatment Centre (LHTC) for the Vale of Glamorgan, re-launching Barry Hospital as a vibrant LHTC providing a centre of excellence for community services within the Vale Locality. A range of integrated health, social care and wellbeing services will be provided to meet local need. This will enable the UHB to provide more services, working alongside local general practices and the UHB's other partners, to care for local people and support them in taking greater responsibility for their own health.

The proposals are driven by the principle that services should be provided as locally as possible, and should focus on helping people maintain, or regain their independence. This will be done by developing strong locality based teams.

There are some building blocks to achieving this vision at Barry Hospital and these include developing a hub of services for older persons to include: Vale Elderly Care Assessment Service (ECAS), the Vale Community Resource Service (CRS), and Day Hospital services

It is important to note that ongoing stakeholder involvement and feedback, as well as ongoing discussions with partners will help shape the future vision for Barry Hospital.

Carers' Involvement Activities and Opportunities

Carers continued to be involved with the work of the Nexus project in a number of different ways. A group of 5 carers have also attended training with the Cardiff and The Vale University Health Board in order to be able to sit on recruitment panels for health board staff. Update on Telephone Survey

Developing Services

Review of Mental Health Services for Older People (MHSOP)

This year there has been a review of the mental health services for older people within Cardiff and The Vale. This review lead by Cardiff and Vale Local Health Board has predominately looked at healthcare provision, but has also included local authority and voluntary sectors to identify the total services provided, what gaps there might be and how the services can be fitted to the demographic changes ahead. The Review has had carer involvement on the Steering Group and at visits that have been made to other Health Boards in Wales. These visits have been an opportunity for members of the Review Group to look at the work of other Health Boards in order to make comparisons and learn from good practice. The Review which has been led by John Lewis (Mental Health Divisional Director at the Health Board) will conclude at the end of November and the report should be available early in the New Year.

Housing and Mental Health Workshop- Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan Monday November 28th, - 9.30am - 1.15pm, Ferrier Hall, City Hall, Cardif

This workshop will discuss the Wales Audit Office Report into Mental Health and Housing, key issues that will improve services and links across housing and mental health & joint planning arrangements, and will inform the development of a Housing and Mental Health Action Plan for Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan.

This event is for <u>all stakeholders</u> - adults and older people - service users, carers, staff - statutory and third sector - to flag up key issues which would improve delivery and inform development of an action plan
